- Why organize research?
 - Saves you time, saves you money, saves you hard work, saves your sanity, saves your ancestors
- Paper files: organize originals in acid free materials and make copies of newspapers; determine how you will store your research (binders, file folders, etc.), categorize your research in a way that makes sense for you, do the work on the backend so that getting to information in your research is easier later on
- Digital files: file naming conventions; understand lossy vs lossless file formats; backup files in cloud
- Research logs: document that tells you where you want to go in your research, how to get there, when you have arrived and where you want to go next
 - Objective, repository name, date, full scope of search and what you found
- Genealogy software: use what's best for you, examine reviews, try trials, learn about the software you choose, Citations
- Software to help you organize
- Websites
